The project will be implemented at the World Heritage site Samarkand-Crossroads of Cultures. Samarkand is one of four World Heritage properties (Itchan kala, historic centre

of Bukhara, historic centre of Shakhrisyabz) in Uzbekistan, which does not have a Management Plan like other 3 World Heritage properties, which is one of the requirements set out by the Operational Guidelines of the World Heritage Convention. Following the WH Committee Decisions which requests Uzbekistan to develop a management plan and with the financial support by the Spanish Funds-in-Trust, a 4-day international workshop was organized on the development of a management plan for the World Heritage property Samarkand-Crossroad of Cultures from 25 to 28 October 2010, where an Action plan for the development of a Management plan for Samarkand was developed. Developing a management plan of Samarkand by implementing this Action plan could serve as a model for the development of management plans for all four World Heritage properties in Uzbekistan, from which local authorities, specialized institutions, specialists and experts of Uzbekistan will greatly benefit.

7. Justification of the project

a) Explain why this project is needed.

Samarkand was inscribed on the World Heritage List in 2001. Due to the lack of a management plan, the World Heritage Committee has repeatedly urged the State Party to elaborate and finalise one in its decisions made at its 29th, 31st, and 32nd sessions. Following the WHC decision 32 COM 7B.79 to implement a Reinforced Monitoring Mechanism to Samarkand, a Reactive Monitoring Mission was organized jointly by UNESCO and ICOMOS. Following the reactive monitoring mission, the World Heritage Committee at its 33rd session in 2009 urged the State Party "to consider a cooperation project with the Ministry of Culture, local authorities, UNESCO and ICOMOS, and possibly other partners, to advance the strategic planning processes and finalize the management plan with a focus on technical assistance and guidance concerning the conservation of the traditional urban fabric, the development of structural restoration projects and the creation of an adequate management framework" and suggested that they "consider an application for international assistance under the World Heritage Fund to support such a collaboration project" (33 COM 7B.84).

In order to implement the decision taken by the World Heritage Committee to advance the development of the Management Plan of Samarkand – Crossroads of Cultures, a 4-day international technical workshop was organised in Samarkand, Uzbekistan, on 25-28 October, 2010 by the UNESCO Tashkent Office and the Government of Uzbekistan in cooperation with the World Heritage Centre, ICOMOS, and ICCROM thanks to the generous financial contribution by the Government of Spain. The Workshop brought together various stakeholders from national and local levels, and it gave the participants an opportunity to get acquainted with the management requirements of World Heritage properties, and it served as a capacity-building for site managers. It also invited the site managers of other World Heritage properties in Uzbekistan, which share similar challenges in the development of a management plan for their respective property. As a result of the workshop, an Action Plan which includes specific works to be carried out in Samarkand was prepared and agreed by the Uzbek authorities.

The aim of this request is to implement the follow-up of the outcome of the international workshop, namely the implementation of some action points the realization of the approved Action Plan for the development of a Management plan for the Samarkand.

The Action Plan was approved on 15.11.2010 by an official letter N: 01-01/460 sent to the UNESCO office in Tashkent by the Principle Scientific-Production Department for the

Preservation and Utilisation of Objects of Cultural Heritage of the Ministry of Culture and Sports of the Republic of Uzbekistan. The Action Plan consists of five parts, and some of the actions have already been taken. For example, defining the Outstanding Universal Value of the site and identifying factors affecting the property in the Part II are being worked on in the framework of Periodic Reporting. There is also substantial information and documentation available on the site, thus the documentation in the Part III only needs update and adjustment, and it does not need to be built from the start. This project, therefore, will mainly focus on the Part IV "Management issues and Management system/frameworks", in particular:

- Development of a detailed action plan for the preparation of the Management Plan;
- Identification of key management issues;
- Identification of gaps in the current management system to address the identified management issues;

In order to develop an appropriate Management Plan there is a need to assess the current existing management system of the site, its framework (institutional, legal, and economic), processes and procedures used to ensure that all tasks required be fulfilled to achieve management objectives for the preservation of the Outstanding Universal Value of the site. Therefore it is proposed that this project targets at identifying key management issues and gaps in the current management system to address them as an important step to further develop a management plan of Samarkand as requested by the World Heritage Committee.

Activities:

1. Development of a detailed action plan for the preparation of the Management Plan

A detailed action plan/work plan should be developed based on the Action Plan that was agreed at the International Workshop, which will outline activities, executors, timeframe and necessary funds. The plan will be prepared by the Board of Monuments in collaboration with the site managers, Samarkand local authorities, UNESCO/WHC, UNESCO Tashkent Office, and an international expert who will closely advise and assist the site managers in developing the Management Plan for Samarkand. This process will involve other stakeholders where necessary.

2. Identification of key management issues

Key management issues (positive or negative) within the historic core of Samarkand city should be identified in the context of preserving the Outstanding Universal Value of the site. Issues such as development, conservation and preservation policies, long-term intentions, etc. are impacts related to management matters. The potential impacts resulting from each issue will be identified and tools for conservation and the objectives of the management system defined. This will be done by the Board of Monuments in close collaboration with the site managers, Samarkand local authorities, UNESCO/WHC, UNESCO Tashkent Office, and an international expert.

3. Identification of gaps in the current management system to address the identified management issues

The purpose is to assess the current management system in respect to the management requirements identified in the point 2. above though collecting and analyzing policies, procedures, programmes, in order to improve the current system to better address the management issues. Based on the results, a list of actions/issues to be improved in relation to the management processes will be established. This will be done by the Board of Monuments in close collaboration with the site managers, Samarkand local authorities, UNESCO/WHC, UNESCO Tashkent Office, and an international expert.
